Warrant Walk-In Procedure Standing Order

(Misdemeanor and Gross Misdemeanor Warrants Only)

Becker County District Court has created a <u>one-time process for certain eligible case types</u> to allow an individual to walk into the courthouse to address their warrant without being arrested.

Therefore, the following process is approved, adopted, and Ordered:

- 1. <u>If you have a warrant on a misdemeanor or gross misdemeanor offense</u> (except those case types noted below*):
 - One Time, Monday-Friday no later than 4:00 pm, you can walk into the Becker County Courthouse to Court Administration; you will:
 - · update your contact information, and
 - sign for a new court date;
 - your previous release conditions will be reinstated (you will get a copy).
 - * This Order does not apply to:
 - o Driving While Impaired
 - o Order for Protection Violations
 - o Harassment Restraining Order Violations
 - o 5th Degree Assault
 - o Domestic Assault
 - o Interference with Privacy
 - o Indecent Exposure
 - o Domestic Abuse No Contact Order Violations

2. If bail or bond was forfeited, it will be reinstated.
